

The Promise of Spring



As e.e.cummings wrote:

when faces called flowers float out of the ground and breathing is wishing and wishing is having — but keeping is downward and doubting and never — it's april (yes, april; my darling) it's spring! yes the pretty birds frolic as spry as can fly yes the little fish gambol as glad as can be (yes the mountains are dancing together)...

when more than was lost has been found has been found and having is giving and giving is living — but keeping is darkness and winter and cringing — it's spring (all our night becomes day) o, it's spring! all the pretty birds dive to the heart of the sky all the little fish climb through the mind of the sea (all the mountains are dancing; are dancing)

have been hearing and seeing more birds every week as they emerge or return, following the path of the sun. The spring equinox has put a bounce in all our steps as we turn from the cold to the returning warmth of summer. (The word equinox means equally balanced, in this case between the dark and the light all over the planet.)

It is a good time to think about how we are part of this holy earth. Humans often think of ourselves as separate from this world, special beings, not even creatures, who ab/use the earth in our greediness; like aliens mining a planet. In fact, in every respect, we essentially belong here; our bodies that are mostly water, breathe with the rhythm of the ocean that embraces the land. In many traditions, there is a religious response to this season. It is when people think about what has died, the winter of the soul or body, and what is being renewed. In ancient Sumeria, the great stag was pictured carrying the sun in his antlers to return warmth to the land. In Celtic beliefs, the regeneration of the antlers of the stag symbolized renewal of life. Here is what Hildegard of Bingen said, "The deer is the Son of God about whom the psalmist writes: 'I thirst for you as a deer after running waters.'"

As we enjoy spring, let us, with St. Francis, see everything — the trees, the tree frogs, the bear cubs, the deer — as an extension of our own life, our own spirit. And just maybe, when we connect with that nature, we will see the holy rising in other people, too. Let us leave behind the past and leap into the surprise of spring and the promise of resurrection!
